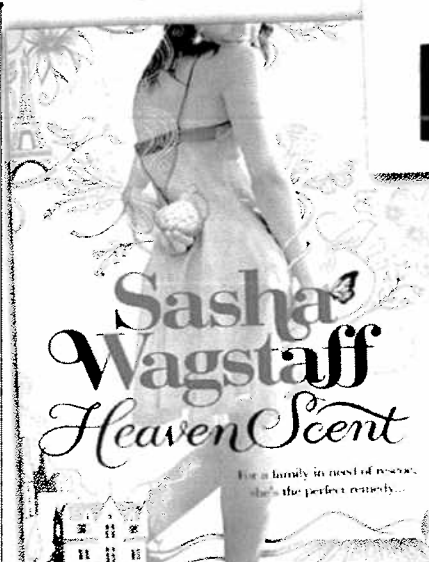
8 MORE AWKWARD SITUATIONS FOR MEN

When he tragically dies in a water-sports accident, the Ducasse family, shocked by her existence, summon Cat to their chateau to see if she's the ruthless gold-digger they think she is.

WHAT'S RIGHT WITH IT? We love skeletons in the closet and, brilliantly, the Ducasses have plenty of them - we particularly enjoyed discovering why handsome Xavier is so damn moody. And thanks to Wagstaff's romantic description of the French countryside, we want to pack up and move there immediately.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH IT? We initially enjoyed the intricate detailing of the perfume-making process but, like Chanel No 5, it soon becomes a tad overpowering.
VERDICT: If you're not due a holiday, but still fancy a drama-filled romance in Provence, look no further.

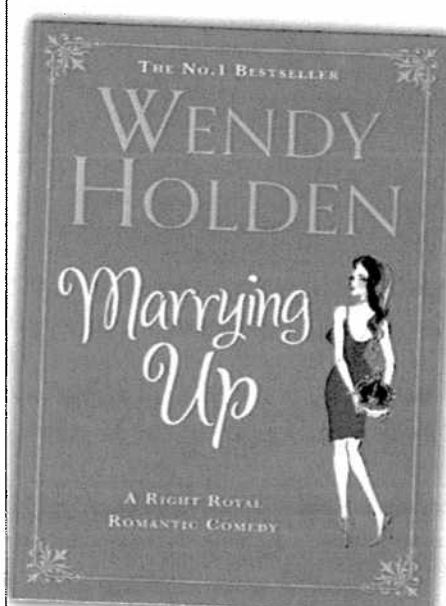
Marrying Up

WHAT'S RIGHT WITH IT? The story veers from the unlikely to the ridiculous, but with so many glitzy characters you won't care how unrealistic it gets.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH IT? The characters are all on their summer break from uni - surely everyone should be chugging pints and working on their tan, rather than trying to snare a rich bloke?
